In our last issue we reported the issues we were facing around our Post Office retaining its protected community status. Thanks to the perseverance of Mike Hawker and the proactive support of Sir Julian Lewis MP we are pleased that this has now been satisfactorily resolved. The Post Office transfer process has fixed timescales and those initial delays in agreeing terms have determined the date we will open for business.

We would like to thank Ian Evans for working with us during these recent Post Office delays. He has been keen to retire for some time but has put his own plans on hold to ensure continuity of the shop and Post Office services in East Boldre. Needless to say, we are all pleased to finally have a firm opening date we can now work to.


National Lottery Heritage Fund Award

We are pleased to say our application for £54,000 was successful.

Part of this covers the kitchen and the external works to the chapel to address the penetrating damp. This includes replacing the eroded stone cills on the front façade, exterior paint work, new guttering and localised repointing.

The other part will cover our heritage activities that aim to research and commemorate the chapel's history as our village's first church. This includes a gravestone recording activity, led by professional archaeologists, that will involve local people in using modern imaging techniques to reveal the eroded inscriptions on the 52 gravestones we have on site.

Funding Status



IN SUMMARY

Target - £718,450 Raised - £690,000 Needed - £28,450

We have raised 96% of the total funds needed.

80% of grant applications have been successful, an exceptional success rate.

HELP – Funds Still Needed

We still need to raise £28,450 to buy the shop shelving and energy efficient chillers. We planned to cover these costs from two specific funds:

- Our application for £25,000 to the Princes Countryside Fund was shortlisted but it was unsuccessful as they prioritised projects in more deprived areas.
- The Charles Burnett Memorial Fund supports local community projects but Hampshire and Isle of Wight Community Fund, who administer their grants, do not accept applications from Community Benefit Societies.

We have cut costs where we can but issues encountered during building works at the 200-year-old chapel have absorbed our contingency budget and pushed our budget up from £715,000 to £718,450.

Despite extensive research, we have been unable to find other funding sources for our chillers and shelving that would enable us to hold to our January opening date.

Building Works update

Thanks to the Tuakana team internal works are largely completed barring final snagging and we are very pleased with the results.



We recently had to take the decision to strip the old paint from the chapel's walls as it is not in good enough condition to paint over. We have absorbed most of this cost but this was responsible for pushing our overall budget up to £718,450.

The exterior of the building will be completed in the next week (weather permitting) and then Rob Keffen's team will be back on site to install the French drain around the chapel (under archaeological supervision) and complete the car park.
